2002	CCA Law, Assembly Bill 117 (Migden), Enacted
2003 to 2005	CPUC CCA Rulemaking
2005	CCA available to local governments
July 2005	CPC identifies CCA in White Paper as key means of reducing greenhouse gases
2007	Notice of intent to pursue CCA and Load Data Requests filed with PG&E and CPUC
October 2008	CCA featured prominently in Sonoma County Community Climate Action Plan
December 2008	Marin Energy Authority established
2009	Renewable Energy Secure Communities Project (completion expected March 2013)
May 2010	Marin Clean Energy program launched – first CCA program operate in California
June 2010	Proposition 16 defeated
December 2010	CPC hires staff to initiate CCA
February 2011	Charles McGlashan of Marin Energy Authority presents on CCA at Regional Climate Protection Authority
March 22, 2011	SCWA funds/initiates CCA Feasibility Study
April 2011	CCA Steering Committee initiated
September 2011	Senate Bill 790 (Leno) enacted, strengthening

October 18, 2011	FS gives “green light” to newly named “Sonoma Clean Power” SCWA directs further evaluation
Nov-Dec, 2011	Presentation of Feasibility Study to cities
April 10, 2012	Goals set, JPA and Implementation Plan, and Request for Information initiated
May-June 2012	Residential and Commercial Market Surveys
July 2012	Draft Joint Powers Agreement circulated
July-Sept. 2012	Presentations to Cities
September 2012	AB 976 anti-CCA legislation vetoed
October 2012	Draft Implementation Plan released
December 2012	Joint Powers Authority formed between Sonoma County and Water Agency Board
February 2013	Request for Proposals Issued
