Empowering Tomorrow's Leaders: ECO2school worked in 13 schools, with 7,507 students participating in programs to take action in the fight against climate change. Not only do these kids reduce their own carbon footprint, but they inspire their peers and family! Cheers to these leaders who make climate action look too cool to ignore!

Community Choice Energy is exploding! In 2014, about 12 California communities were exploring Community Choice. This year, it's more than 70. The Center for Climate Protection is helping spread Sonoma County's success.

REASONS TO WORK HARDER

Sonoma County produced about 3.9 million tons of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in 2014. This signifies a small drop from 2013, a result of decreasing usage of both electricity and natural gas and lower emission intensity due to increased supply from renewable sources (Sonoma Clean Power and PG&E).

We have much to celebrate, but we have a long way to go to reach our ambitious near-term goal, as well as our 2050 statewide goal. Let's push harder to increase the momentum of these downward trends in GHG emissions.
