Survey of Central Valley registered voters

Our survey found that:

- 69% want a choice about electricity
- 69% want revenues reinvested in the local economy
- 68% are supportive of community ownership of resources
- 71% believe it is important their electricity come from clean sources like solar and wind as opposed to fossil sources
- 73% believe it is important to reduce greenhouse gas emissions



Economic benefits for Fresno County

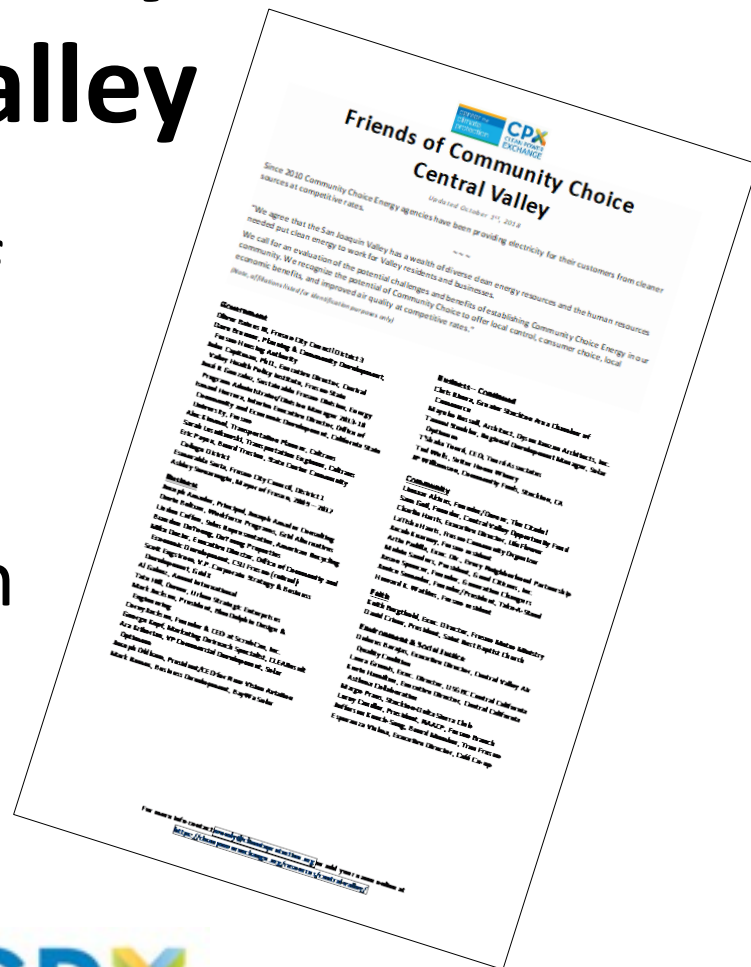
Our 2017 study found that a Fresno County Community Choice agency that gets 10% of its electricity from local solar would, over 6 years:

- Create over 3,000 jobs
- Generate over \$380 million in additional economic activity

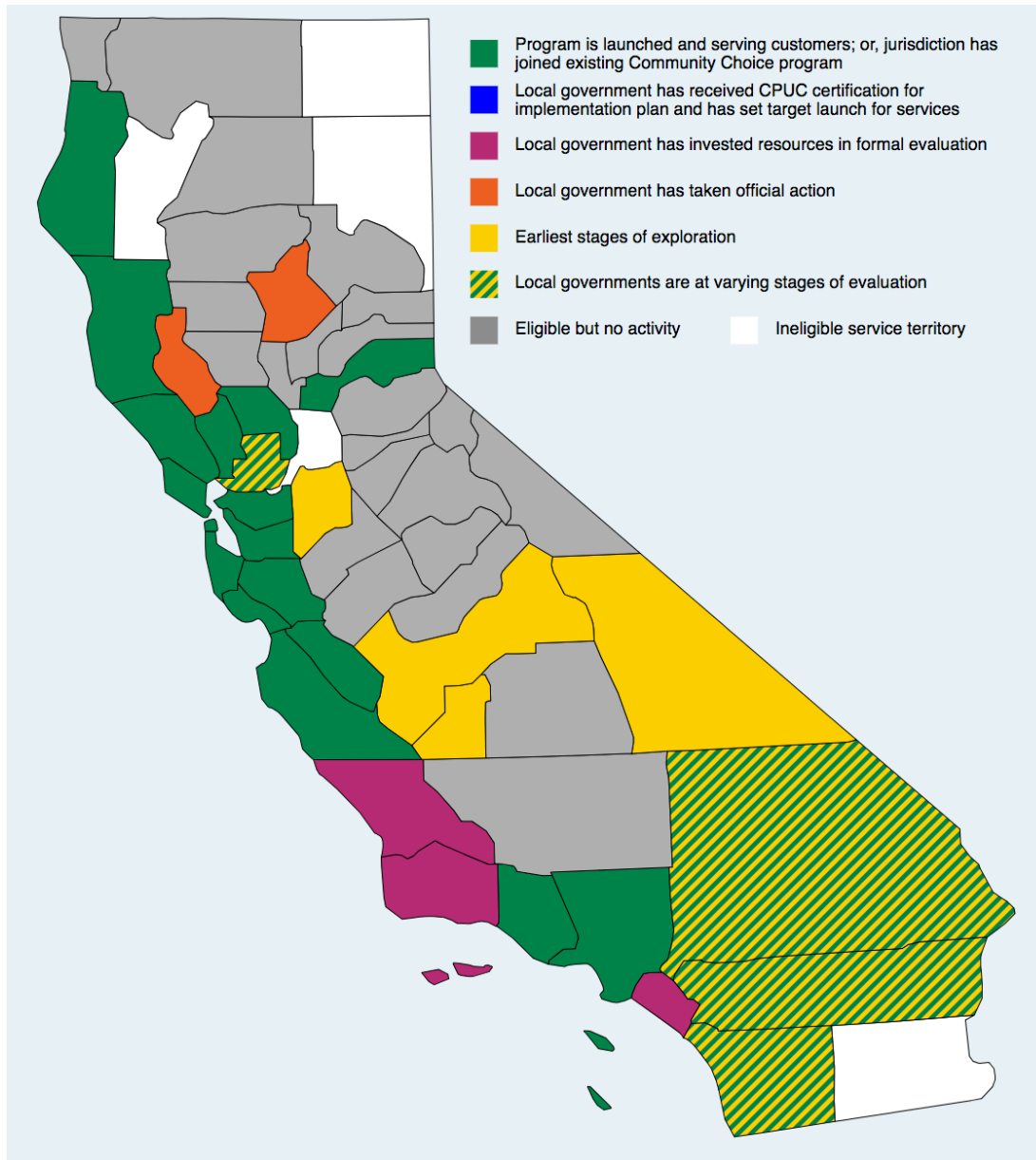

The KRCD and 13 local governments – Kings County and the cities of Clovis, Corcoran, Dinuba, Fresno, Kerman, Kingsburg, Lemoore, Hanford, Parlier, Reedley, Selma, and Sanger – worked together to implement a Community Choice program in the Central Valley to reduce costs, increase energy reliability and bring additional renewable energy resources to valley residents and businesses.
