California 'No time for inaction': how a California refinery disaster created a generation of activists

Ten years ago, a fire at Chevron forced thousands to seek health treatment. For young people, it was a transformative moment



- Richmond is home to a large Southeast Asian refugee population
- Also home to the largest stationary polluter in the state (in GHG emissions), superfund sites, and heavy industry
- Oakland is home to a historic Chinatown, an Asian American enclave under high displacement pressure and surrounded by 3 polluting freeways

Bay Area hits record highs as blistering heat wave continues across region August 14, 2020

Rolling Power Outage Triggers Oakland Estuary Sewage Spill: 50,000 Gallons Discharged Into Waterway August 14, 2020

Flaring at Chevron Richmond refinery sends black smoke above Bay Area

Event, during a Spare the Air alert, caused by "an upset at a process unit" and brought a response from a Contra Costa County hazardous materials team **August 15, 2020**

A month of Spare the Air days, and the sky still may not be clearing

Record streak extended to 30 days as the haze remains

September 14, 2020

'Triple whammy' of smoke, heat, smog to spoil Bay Area weekend air quality September 24, 2020
