Re: Support SBX1 2 (Skinner)

Dear Senator Skinner:

We write to express our support for SBX1 2, legislation to create a price gouging penalty that is needed to hold the oil industry accountable and protect Californians from the industry's greed and profiteering.

While Californians paid as much as \$2.60 more for their gasoline than average US gasoline prices, California oil refiners continued to post record-breaking windfall profits—literally profiting off Californians' pain at the pump.

Oil refiners' reports to their investors showed that the companies more than doubled their margin from refining gasoline in California from an average of 32 cents per gallon over the last twenty years to 69 cents per gallon in the first nine

months of 2022. Moreover, their California refining profits were <u>30% greater</u> than their refining profits reported anywhere else in the nation or world.

Setting a windfall profits cap on refining gasoline will save consumers billions of dollars in overcharges.

The California Energy Commission must set a fixed maximum gross gasoline refining margin low enough to protect against future price gouging. In addition, it is critical that penalties are high enough to negate incentives to ignore or circumvent the law and avoid jeopardizing the efficacy of the law with unnecessary discretion to the agency to grant exemptions.

There are numerous examples from around the world of successful policies that can cap windfall profits, bring relief to consumers, and disincentivize future price gouging.

Oil refiners are taking advantage of California consumers because they can. In the first three quarters of 2022, California's five biggest refiners—Chevron, Marathon, PBF Energy Phillips 66 and Valero—<u>raked in \$67.6 billion in profits, nearly quadruple the same period in the prior year.</u>

The oil industry is spending their record profits to undermine our democracy with disinformation, delay action on climate change, and overturn vital protections for communities living next to toxic oil drilling sites. Windfall Big Oil profits threaten our pocketbooks, our democracy, and our health. California oil companies are bullying working Californians—and since bullies only respond to strength, we need our leaders to hold firm.

We support a windfall profits cap to rein in refiners' unconscionable price-gouging and provide greater transparency for California's gasoline market. Additionally, given that SBX1 2 also notes the legislature's intent to establish a multi-agency process "to plan for and monitor progress towards the state's... transition away from petroleum fuels," we urge you to partner with environmental justice groups to ensure that transition is rapid, equitable, and just.

We hope that these unprecedented windfall oil profits will not only lead to a strong profits cap and penalty under SBX1 2, but also prompt the legislature to redouble its efforts to move California away from dirty fossil fuels to a healthier, sustainable future.
