Identifying grant opportunities



#### What is Environmental Justice?

Environmental justice is the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental legislation and policies.

Environmental justice efforts ensure that all communities have:

- equitable protection from environmental and health hazards
- equal access to the decision-making process to have a healthy environment.



## What is Energy Justice?



Energy justice refers to the equity, affordability, accessibility and participation in the energy system and energy transition for all. Energy justice efforts are aimed at:

- reducing energy costs and burdens on low-income customers,
- avoiding disproportionate impacts and ensuring the equitable distribution of the benefits of energy generation, transmission and transition,
- access to reliable and clean energy,
- participation for communities in energy sector decision-making and development.
