

Thriving Communities Technical Assistance Centers (TCTACs)

- \$177 million nationwide
 - · Each TCTAC received at least \$10 million funded incrementally
 - 5-year project period
 - Inter-agency and Intra-agency partner Department of Energy (DOE)
- Regional EJ TCTACs
 - Provide direct TA to communities in assigned EPA regions/geographic area(s)
- National EJ TCTACs
 - Will coordinate with the Regional EJ TCTACs, fill gaps in coverage, develop national databases, host TA summits, etc.
 - National EJ TCTAC devoted specifically to addressing the needs of tribal communities
