## Re: AB 3233 – The Local Environmental Choice and Safety Act – SUPPORT

To the Honorable Members of the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources ~ Chair Bryan, Vice Chair Flora, and Assembly Members Bauer-Kahan, Friedman, Hoover, Kalra, Mathis, Muratsuchi, Pellerin, Wicks, and Wood:

We are writing to express our strong support for <u>AB 3233</u> (Addis), the Local Environmental Choice and Safety Act, which would safeguard the longstanding authority of local governments to regulate and phase out oil and gas operations in their jurisdictions and affirm the state's commitment to protect the public from oil and gas pollution.

Local governments in California have always had the authority to regulate oil and gas operations to protect the public and the environment from harmful pollution. Cities and counties can prohibit, restrict, or regulate oil and gas development in all or part of the areas under their jurisdiction. They also help the state achieve its climate, health, and environmental goals. Oil produced in California is among the dirtiest and most climate-damaging in the world.

Many cities and counties have decades-old ordinances that impose such restrictions. These local measures have served a vital role in protecting residents' health and safety. Other jurisdictions have passed oil and gas laws more recently or are in the process of enacting them.

But recent efforts to enact local protections have been under attack by the oil industry. In an attempt to intimidate local officials, the industry asserts that a recent decision by the California Supreme Court eliminated a local government's power to restrict oil and gas production. Even though the Court's decision was narrowly focused on a single local ordinance and a statute enacted in 1961, the industry has distorted the ruling to sow confusion regarding how authority is split between local and state governments when regulating oil and gas. This attack on other lawful ordinances has had a chilling effect on the ability of local governments to take action to limit oil and gas pollution and protect local communities.

The bill clarifies the state's oil and gas law to affirm the right of cities and counties to impose regulations, limits, or prohibitions on oil and gas development, and specify that cities and counties may prohibit any extraction technique, such as fracking, wastewater disposal, or steam injection. It will also confirm that the state's oil and gas supervisor must prioritize the health and safety of Californians and protect the environment and climate as the state moves toward a cleaner and sustainable future.
