## **Resources: Phasing Out Oil Refining in California**

- <u>SBX1-2 Implementation Proceeding</u>: The 2023 "Price Gouging" bill included a provision for the California Energy Commission and California Air Resources Board to produce a Transportation Fuels Assessment and Transportation Fuels Transition Plan (Transition to zero emission fuels).

This is a potentially historic and groundbreaking measure in line with the "Polluter Pays" principle.
