#### Global climate goals bold but inadequate


#### UN IPCC 1.5C Report, Oct 2018:

- Cut emissions by 45% by 2030, AND
- remove 100 to 1000 Gt CO2e from atmosphere

to achieve **net-zero emissions by 2050** and **stay under the 1.5C** dangerous warming threshold agreed to in 2015 Paris accord



### UNEP Gap Report, Oct 2024: Current policies => 3.1 C warming! Countries on track for ~9% increase in emissions! "Code Red for Humanity"

## Spoiler Alert: CA isn't on track to meet its climate change mandates — and a new analysis says it's not even close

March 15, 2024

Must now cut GHGs by 4.6% every year, to be on track for CA 2030 goal





### **High Level Observations**

Observation: Session characterized by incrementalism, limited progress, Climate movement on defense AND-- end of session was chaotic, anti-democratic!





### Big Oil spent record \$15.3m lobbying in CA in first half 2024=> Chevron #1; PG&E spent ~\$3m

### ABX2-1- Assembly Special Session-signed into law

- Gov's Office tried last minute, <u>SB 950</u>, to increase storage at refineries; help prevent supply shortages, price spikes for consumers;
- But bill could have expanded fossil fuel infrastructure
- Then called Special Session; <u>ABX2-1</u> passed
- Dysfunctional- crammed in
- BUT changes made to improve it does not allow new storage to be built


### Answer to Affordability Crisis? \$30 credit?? AB 3121(Petri-Norris) killed!

- Another last minute bill- "gut and amend"
- Would have given ratepayers a one time \$30 credit.....
- by cutting existing programs that support energy efficiency in schools and solar and storage for low income households and multi family apartments!!

## ON HOLD (for now) SB 252 (Gonzalez): Divest state retirement funds from Fossil Fuels

- Divest public employees and state teacher retirement funds
- Co-sponsors:
  - Fossil Free CA
  - CA Faculty Assoc.
  - The Climate Center
- Held in Committee



130+ organizations in support







### SB 308 Becker-- CDR Guardrails Dead for now

SB 308 (Becker) - Carbon Dioxide Removal

- Held in Asm Appropriations - aimed to set an interim target for carbon dioxide removal to balance out remaining greenhouse gas emissions, and achieve the target through the utilization of existing or new state programs.



#### **VETOED:**

### **SB 1374** (Becker)

Allows schools and some apartment buildings to fully benefit from their own solar - aggregated net metering - saving significant money on energy bills and incentivizing continued solar deployment.

The only bill supporting rooftop solar to make it to the Governor





### SB1420 (Caballero) Loosens Hydrogen Standards: Signed by the Governor


- Erodes H2 production standards, allows streamlining of CEQA for hydrogen projects, allows combustion and bioenergy-based hydrogen production.
- We and many of our allies opposed this bill

### PROGRESS: SB 59 (Skinner) Bidirectional EVs on Gov's desk!



Concerned Scientists



- 100+ orgs in support
- Brought <u>national attention</u> to bidirectional EVs
- Growing momentum with the auto industry, eg Toyota,
- Inspired a <u>federal bill</u>.
- Quoted in 20+ media stories over past 12 months
- Foundation of GFTF

SB 59: authorizes CEC to establish categories of EVs sold in CA that will be required to have bidirectional charging capability.



#### PROGRESS: Signed into Law Sept 25 2024

### Make Polluters Pay- Signed into Law

- AB 1866 (Hart) Accelerating closure of 40k idle wells-- Increases the idle well fees and increases the amount of wells that must be eliminated under an idle well management plan
- 2. AB 3233 (Addis) Strengthen Local govt authority over O&G wells and drilling
- 3. AB 2716 (Bryan) requires that low-producing wells in the Inglewood oilfield (835 wells) to be plugged. Noncompliance fine of \$10K per month







#### **PROGRESS:**

- Restored some of state climate budget
- Passed \$10 billion climate bond -- Prop 4 now on November ballot
- Co-led coalition working to protect CA historic \$54 billion five year climate investments (2022)
- Saved \$100s of millions in clean transportation, clean energy and natural climate solutions
  - ...but big cuts and long deferrals still remain.





#### **Opportunities for 2025**

- Prop 4 we must pass it climate budget was cut this year.
  2025 expecting another state deficit
- Approximately 31 new legislators after the election likely a more moderate Senate
- > Polluter's Pay helps fund clean energy transition
- Affordability Governor and Legislature can't ignore, IOU rates keep increasing
- ➤ Cap & Trade Reauthorization/Reform coming to the legislature in 2025, state's biggest climate program
- Carbon Removal good chance of another bill job creation, set guardrails for industry, model for country
- ➤ Governor Newsom's shifting ambitions support him to vision and leave a real climate legacy



### **Summary of the Summary**

- > A lot was attempted, but a lot was thwarted
- Some good things for the climate got done
- ➤ A lot more is needed to meet CA targets for emissions reduction much less what is required by science
- > There are opportunities to do more next year

### No more business as usual...sampling of 2024 Climate bills killed, gutted or held:

X ACA 16 (Bryan) - Constitutional Right for Clean Air/Environment

X SB 1497 (Menjivar) - Polluters Pay Climate Cost Recovery Act of 2024 - required fossil fuel polluters to pay their fair share of the damage caused by the sale of their products from 2000 and 2020

X AB 2054 (Bauer-Kahan)- limited revolving door between CPUC & regulated utilities
