AB 1167 (Berman) - Request for Signature Re:

Dear Governor Newsom:

The undersigned organizations respectfully request your signature on Assembly Bill ("AB") 1167, the California Ratepayer Protection Act. AB 1167 will protect ratepayers from funding for-profit utilities' political and promotional activities in their gas and electric bills. AB 1167 is commonsense legislation that furthers California's efforts to address energy bill affordability.

Utilities should not be slipping the costs of their advocacy into customer bills, but as previously reported in the Sacramento Bee, this is what utilities like SoCalGas have been doing for years. Similarly, PG&E spent millions in customer funds earmarked for wildfire safety on television ads to promote its safety image.² AB

1167 will shine a light on utilities' political influence machines and help curb utilities' abuse of millions of dollars of customer money.

AB 1167 establishes a needed structure to ensure utilities keep their political and promotional expenses out of customer bills. It clearly defines the activities utility shareholders must pay for. It then increases transparency so misuse of customer money is much easier to spot. States like Connecticut that have adopted similar transparency provisions are now identifying millions in political influence costs shareholders must pay for.³ To incentivize compliance, AB 1167 requires the Public Utilities Commission impose penalties when a utility is caught attempting to pass political and promotional costs onto customers.

Following states like New York, Maryland, Colorado, and Maine, AB 1167 also prohibits utilities from charging customers for the costs of their expensive memberships in outside lobbying groups like the American Gas Association and Edison Electric Institute. These provisions of the bill will catch California up with best practices adopted elsewhere.

California residents are already facing an affordability crisis with their utility bills, and they deserve to know their money is going toward the core utility services they receive, not promotional advertising, lobbying, and other activities primarily for shareholder benefit.
